# 9. PLANNING APPLICATIONS RECEIVED

Members are request to **note** that the Clerk completed the Bowland Character consultation. The questions were very vague and more information has been requested.

### 10. UPDATE ON EXISTING ISSUES / MATTERS OF CONCERN TO MEMBERS

This item provides Members with an opportunity to raise any new concerns to be actioned by the Clerk or to be added to the next Agenda.

At the January meeting, Members were informed that LCC stated that they were looking into the flooding issues and drainage at Bourne Brow. The Clerk was requested to also ask them for an update on the plans to re-open Walmsley Bridge Lane. Their reply states:

We visited Bourne Brow on 27 January 2025 to clean and inspect the gullies. I am advised that no issues were identified in the local drainage system which would slow or prevent the flow of water from travelling along the drainage pipes. The suggestion is that the recent heavy and at times extreme rainfall washed silt and soil into the gullies from further along the road, or from the nearby fields. Officers reported that following our cleaning of the system it was noted to be running clearly and without any evidence of impediment.

I am sorry, but at this time I cannot advise when Walmsley Bridge Lane will re-open to through traffic. I understand that following further investigation issues have been identified in its drainage system. Works are being programmed to resolve these, along with those planned for the structure of the road.

Claughton Parish Council did not respond to requests asking if they had approached LCC about the delay.

Also at the January meeting, Members reported a collapsed road at Back Lane / Stoney Lane. LCC's reply states:-

In light of your email, we have raised an order to attend site and complete the necessary remedial action. We aim to do this as soon as practical, which will be no earlier than April 2025. In the interim, we have erected temporary barriers to make the area safe. This should reduce the risk of injury collisions at this location and help ensure that the carriageway here remains passable for all highway users.
